

Explanation of Court Order

MANDATORY COURT ORDER ATTACHED - Court File CV-17-587516, MANDATES removal of the content detailed above in Google search results:

Exhibit 1 paragraphs 1-5, and Schedule "A". Paragraph 5 of Exhibit 1 provides for the removal of any and all additional web pages that reference, and or hyperlink to, the Defamatory Content and/or the Defamatory Postings. This URL reproduces and republishes the URL and the illegal content in the Orders, and are an attempt by the defendant to get around Google's removals and the Order. The attached court order of Justice Archibald was issued in this action and makes a finding that content that is similar to the content of this URL is false, defamatory, salacious and malicious (para. 2). The order requires the removal of any content that is similar to it from search engine results (para. 3).

Dear sir / madam, I am one of 53 named plaintiffs in a civil action commenced before the Ontario Superior Court of Justice in Toronto, Canada (Clancy et al v Farid Action No. CV-[REDACTED]6).

I have PREVIOUSLY submitted a de-indexing request to Google. To date, that request has NOT been fully implemented. These URLs continue to appear in search results - therefore violating the terms of the Court Order.

I write to request AGAIN the de-indexing of search engine results.

The action arises out of a long-term campaign of cyber-bullying, harassment and defamation published by the defendant, a resident of Toronto, Canada, on numerous URLs hosted in the United States. On

December 11, 2017 and on March 5, 2018, the Ontario Superior Court of Justice issued orders requiring the removal of the URLs from the Internet (the "Removal Order") and the de-indexing of those sites from search engine results. In the Removal Order, the Court held that the URLs contain content that constitutes "false, salacious, outrageous and malevolent defamation of the Plaintiffs". This Removal Order has now been recognized and enforced by the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Texas. Please provide me with a link or email address to which I can submit the US Court order, for your information.

The URLs listed in the Removal Order violate your Terms of Use.

They have caused and will continue to cause significant damages and irreparable harm to me.

Therefore, please take steps to de-index the URLs as soon as possible from Google search results in the United States (google.com).
